Trails Coming to New Glarus Woods State Park



CORP has been working hard with the Friends of New Glarus Woods over the past several years to initiate a trail system in this 410 acre park, one mile south of New Glarus. We know everyone is looking for an excuse to take an excursion to New Glarus and visit the brewery, just across the highway!

This will be the first bike-optimized single-track in Green County, leveraging the park's topography to create beginner and intermediate trails. It will expand CORP's network of trails and share single-track mountain biking with a whole new audience. This new system will also enable a local NICA team that will attract student-athletes from the broader Green County, to further grow the sport.

A trail concept plan is being developed and we will be working with the DNR over the spring and summer to refine it. If all goes as scheduled we'll begin construction of a one-mile beginner loop in September, with two-mile segments following in phases as fundraising allows. This is a \$350,000 project to create over 7 miles of trail in the park.

We've raised \$140,000 so far. A great start! Stay tuned for updates!

Trail Passes

It's that time of year again. While we are extremely grateful to our land managers who are able to provide access for free, providing the land required for quality trails is not cheap, and some of our partners require trail passes or memberships. Please respect their rules, and if you ride at [Seminole](#), [CamRock](#), [or Badger Prairie](#), [Blue Mound](#), or [Blackhawk](#), pick up the appropriate pass. And while you are at it, make sure you are up to date on your [CORP membership](#); without us, local riding opportunities would be very limited! Buy all four and it's still less than a lift ticket at most ski hills, which is a pretty good deal for a whole year of riding!
